## Vice-Presidents Report

*What information would you like our club to be providing to you at our monthly meetings?*

Fall has arrived and there will soon be a chill in the air. This means that all your wood burning neighbors will be putting in their supply of winter wood. There has been many excellent project pieces found in those piles, so make sure you visit the neighbors and swap a turned item for the chance to inspect their stockpile.

The club will be distributing the fun turn pieces at this month's meeting so make sure you get to the meeting, collect your paid membership card and choose your block. This year we are happy to be offering a larger piece of wood than in the past. It will be 4" x 8" x 8" piece which allows many more design options. The wood species will be a mix of birch, maple and oak, with the exact number of each species unknown at this time. Also the club has secured extra pieces as we did last year and we will be selling the extra to any member who wishes to pick up some inexpensive blocks. The extra pieces will be sold (after fun turn pieces are reserved) at \$4.00 each or 3 for \$10.00

The fun turn blocks are partially seasoned but will require rough turning or end sealing now if you will be delaying the final turning until later in the winter. If you are rough turning, an initial wall thickness of 10% of diameter should be sufficient for final seasoning. For those folks who wish to wait, the block needs to be protected from losing moisture too quickly. I will be providing a handout at the meeting that describes how to do this if you are unsure of the methods.

What information would you like our club to be providing to you at our monthly meetings? Is there a special turning technique that interests you, a project you would like more information on, some demonstration that we have not shown before? Your executive wants to make the club as informative and helpful as possible. 
