Meeting Notes Feb.23, 2015



President Dianne Looker could not attend the meeting as she was traveling. Dave asked if there were any new or visiting people on hand tonight and as luck would have it Calum Ewing's grandson Simon Lunn decided to drop by and take in a meeting. Welcome Simon maybe we'll see you as a member sometime in the future.

The "Do not Handle" table from now on will be set up separate from the regular show and tell table just so the two don't get mixed up and members prized turnings

won't suffer an unfortunate accident. It's nice to see members taking advantage of the "do not touch" table as it gives others the advantage of seeing turnings that otherwise would have been left at home.

Dave asked how many people may be taking advantage of the **Binh Pho** demos and hands on. Binh is scheduled for April 24/25. Dave is interested because we need to let Binh know what we want him to talk about. He is famous for piercing/air brushing/thin walled turnings. We are still looking for a proper venue and will let you know how and when to sign up.

A general discussion took place on a number of topics. It seems Dave took over right where he left off last month on questions about photography and lighting. Calum mentioned that he purchased a light tent kit from Amazon for about \$60. Everything needed is included and there are a number of them so look around. Cell phone cameras have come a long way and can produce a beautiful picture. They now have shutter and lighting adjustments. If your using your digital camera why not try connecting the cable to your computer as you would to download pictures but choose the computer remote control option and use it to control the camera functions. The large display on your computer is much easier to make decisions on the photographs as you go and allows you to play with the controls to produce photographs you like.

Richard Ford, our resident tool maker, was busy experimenting with beading tools but hasn't come up with something he likes yet, I'm sure it will happen very soon. There was also talk of a Sorby Spindle Master, it has a rounded underside with a bevel and a flat top, sort of a round nosed scraper with a bevel. Next was the "Skewchigouge" made by Crown tools it is a combination skew and gouge, shaped like a sharpened spoon. The talk went on to other topics like the Mary E Black exhibition, the deadline is May 11, 2015. Gluing angled pieces was another topic and of course as all discussions do, sand paper. Are all 400's the same, are all manufacturers using the same scales and grades of stone? Certainly not and it seems that when you get what you like you tend to stick with it.


