## **November Meeting**

On Wednesday, November 14th our regular monthly meeting was most irregular as it was convened on the 2nd. Wednesday instead of the 3rd. Monday. As well, instead of the regular venue, we met at 6 pm in the show room of "**Busy Bee**" tools for a demonstration of **Robert Sorby Turning tools and equipment.** 



Mr. **Tony Kwasniak**, a representative of Sorby, was here to demonstrate at the Atlantic Wood show. **Bill Luther** arranged with the company to have "Tony" do a private demo for our guild. Accordingly, a large group of members and some non-members sat down for Tony's demo.

He told us that the had been up at 3 pm British time to fly to Canada and had arrived only a short time before meeting with us; in spite of fatigue and jet lag, he made a very interesting presentation. He started off by telling us that he was not there to demonstrate woodturning technique but to show us how we could use Robert Sorby tools to improve our work. It was very evident that he was a very skilled "turner." Next, he demo'd a sharpening system which uses a MDF disk mounted on the head stock of the

lathe and fitted with various grits of self-adhesive, aluminum oxide sandpapers. To finish, a leather washer, charged with a polish is fitted to the disk. The chisel is supported on the lathe's tool rest. This system, he explained, is for spindle gouges, skews and parting tools and as the chisel is sharpened on the flat side of the disk, the tool's bevel is flat. After polishing with the leather washer, the bevel had a mirror finish which only had to be touched up with a diamond hone. His honing compound, he explained was "tongue" oil which he thought his British variety might be better than a Canadian type.

During the evening Tony also demonstrated a "Spindlemaster" - a type of rounded skew; "Sandmaster", - sanding system; a beading tool; a shear scraper with detachable heads; and a texturing, chattering system.

The Guild extends its thanks to **Tony** and the **Robert Sorby** Company for a fine meeting and to **Bill Luther** and the **Busy Bee** Company for arranging the demo and providing the facilities.

Chris Palmer won the door prize, a 1/2" splindlemaster.

Incidentally, 3 new members, **Arthur Learning**, **Brian Barker** and **Raymond Chaisson** joined the Guild at the conclusion of the meeting. Raymond now has set the record for the farthest distance to travel to our meetings as his home is in Dalhousie, New Brunswick. Welcome to you all.
