**Library News:Gordon Marshall** has decided to step down as assistant acting librarian at the end of the current season (the June AGM). I'd like to thank Gordon for the efforts he has put in to date and for the efforts he will continue to make over the next few months.

The library is really too big for one person to easily handle. In order to continue providing the library services at the current level, I need someone to volunteer to be acting assistant librarian (I've been "acting librarian" for 11 years or so, waiting for someone to officially volunteer for the job!).

Here are the pros: you have most of the books and videos in your possession, so if you want to read or watch something, you probably have it right there. Further, your name will never appear in the "overdue" list for books and videos. Finally, you will have the undying gratitude of me and (I hope) many other members

In order to be fair, I should list the cons as well. First, your presence is expected at all of the meetings by people wishing to see the library or bring things back, although, of course that won't always be possible; so if, for example, you only get to half of the meetings each year, this is not the job for you. Second, you have to be prepared to sign things in and out at the beginning of the meetings, which means you are a bit restricted in your socializing at the start of the meetings. Third, between meetings you have to go through your records and tell Chris Palmer (in his job as newsletter editor) which items are overdue. Fourth, periodically you should compare what you are in possession of with what is signed out, because occasionally some members walk away with items without signing them out, and a gentle reminder in the newsletter often gets these items returned.

Of course, if you would like to volunteer to be the non-acting librarian, I would not stand in your way!
