



Woodturning Tragedy ... from Don Moore July 24th 2019

Even from it's infancy the NWG has always stressed the necessity and importance of safety in all aspects of woodturning. Simple items like keeping oily rags in an airtight container, whereby twice different members had shop fires due to neglect, Fortunately in both cases the outcome was manageable. Why we need helmets, smocks, ventilation, dust collectors, etc...

The Nova Woodturner's Guild often schedules a monthly meeting highlighting safety. Most recently having "Workshop Safety" from a Plastic Surgeon's Point of View with **Dr. Steven Morris** of **Dalhousie University**. Dr Morris made a very professional and eye opening presentation regarding the physical implications of shop related injuries and how he personally has endeavoured to help those individuals with their rehabilitation.

I personally, clearly remember an incident when a piece from a burl broke free and struck me in the head. Fortunately I was wearing my Helmet. Clearly the first indication of trouble was only when my head was violently snapped back, well after the fact... Obviously I never saw it coming and even with my helmet on, I was most fortunate to only sustain a headache.

I am wanting to draw your attention once again to safety, respect and education. Of course serious injury always comes to others, right, not in our community, not to me ... wishful thinking I'm afraid.

Because of my involvement with woodturning, an individual recently related to me of a tragedy he learned of involving a fellow woodturner in our Atlantic region. Tragically, an intelligent, well educated, sensible 32 year old man was killed while working on his lathe. Please take the time to let this clearly register with you. Let us all learn from this young man's tragedy.

So the next time you're in your shop take assessment of things, review what and where things could be made safer. Oh we've all done it from time to time," this will only take a minute", it's only a few cuts, just a small piece, right... what could possibly happen??? Yikes...

"Yes, 911, how can I help you?"

Summer Barbecue cont.


As a few people started to filter away around 6PM there was talk of several rounds of Washer Toss. Bragging rights were at stake so competition was to be fierce!!
