
If I can get them I will post them. They are a history of what was happening in our club and woodturning in NS at that time.

Another feature we use on the website is the Mail Forwarding program.

This allows us to use an email address and redirect mail sent to that address to another address or multiple addresses.

For example an email sent to executive@novawoodturnersguild.com will have 1 copy forwarded to each of the NWG executives. Or a message may be sent to the holder of an office by using the Office name on the list below followed by @novawoodturnersguild.com so you don't need to know the personal email of the person holding the office. The advantage is the same address will work no matter who holds the office. Example: Today an email sent to president@novawoodturnersguild.com would be forwarded to Gary Landry our current president.

Another Forwarding address set up 2 years ago is: members@novawoodturnersguild.com (The webmaster@novawoodturnersguild.com can add your email addresses to a list associated with members@novawoodturnersguild.com you only need to request it.)

How it works:

A copy of emails sent to members@novawoodturnersguild.com is sent to everyone in the member group. The Senders email is displayed at the top of the email so you can see who it is from. If there is any problems delivering to an email on the list the sender will get an error message with the problem email displayed. Please send a copy of the error message to webmaster@novawoodturnersguild.com and I will fix the problem. (Not always fast)

If you reply to one of the emails sent to <u>members@novawoodturnersguild.com</u> The reply goes to the sender of the message.

If you want your reply to go to everyone on the list add members@novawoodturnersguild.com to the send to address box.

As you can see there are some limits to this a mail forwarding service and it has been suggested Facebook may be a better way of communicating and I'm sure there are many other ways too.

Recently we have seen a big increase in the use of members@novawoodturnersguild.com and it seems to be working well. Presently there are 32 NWG members on the forwarding list.

Finally if you need to contact All the NWG members the only way is to request the secretary@novawoodturnersguild.com (Calum today) forward your email to all NWG members

We found a piece of driftwood with a small burl on one such walk recently, and I decided to turn a wee bowl.

Nothing fancy, no super thin walls. Just a cute little bowl that got me out to the shop and turning. It's about 3 " diameter and less than 2" high...

(This) was a bowl turned as part of the hands on workshop that Ashey Harwood did in 2018. I won it I sanded the foot flat, (did) some pyrography.

I donated it to a local fundraiser - where it went for over \$100.

I called it "A Swift Swirl in Wood". I wanted to evoke the image of the chimney swifts that swirl into a local chimney.

I sanded the area that was not burned, to a very smooth surface and left the part to be burned rougher. So, the final bowl had a very interesting tactile surface of silky smooth mixed with the bumps and lines of the burned area.

Just a quick paintbrush holder for my daughter who has been asking for one

for some time now. So to the garage I went and found a piece of firewood. As I was hollowing it out, a crack formed so I sewed it up with some coloured wire.



Doug Allen:

This is my first attempt using the Lee Valley ceramic shaft-less pepper mill mechanism. I plagiarized this "chewed pear" design from Chris West's book. The mechanism he uses calls for different internal measurements and I did not have a piece of wood the diameter his plan calls for. Concentration was definitely required and think proportions suffered. The punky, presumably worm eaten area I filled with CA - perhaps over accentuated.

The apple wood I cut and stabilized >2 years ago. Believe I followed the usual recommended

technique, but it appears apple is a challenge to dry - lots of checking.

Leo Westhaver:

A little bowl about 6.5" dia. x 4" high. The grain didn't look too interesting so I decided to leave a rim around the top and try some pyrography. (Did) some flowers connected by a vine. This was my first attempt at it??. I believe the wood is Ash.
